Learning Together Trust theme for 2024 -


the year of 'Connecting and Flourishing'



- Mathematical equipment: things like calculators, dice, dominos, clocks, playing cards can be fun especially if you can get a whole group of you in the same outfit!
- Characters from books work well: Thing 1 and Thing 2 from The Cat in the Hat, Tock or The Mathemagician from The Phantom Tollbooth for example.
