We are sorry to say goodbye to Mrs Grainger and wish her well for the future.

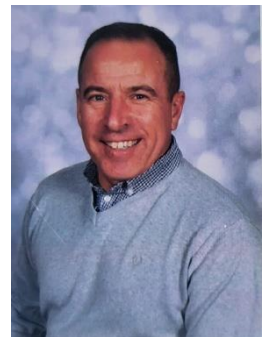
We have ensured that the teaching staff joining school this year are dedicated, experienced practitioners with successful track records in school improvement as well as being excellent classroom practitioners.

September Class Teachers

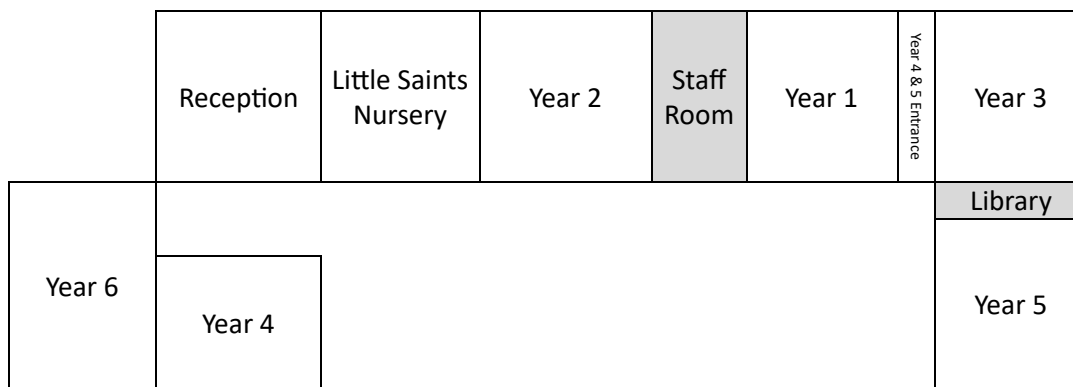
We are pleased to reveal our class structure for September.

Of course, there will be times when other staff members will be working within the different classes, for example when teachers have PPA (Planning Preparation and Assessment) Time or times when specific children are being supported with their individual additional needs.

September Classrooms

Having consider the layout of the school, the learning environment and home time routines we are having a move of two classes for September, Year 1 will do a swap with Year 6.



This means that Year 1 will be provided with access to a shared Key Stage 1 outdoor area as well as an external door onto the playground for drop off/pick up. This layout will also provide Year 6 children with independence as they have their own entrance/exit so they can either join younger siblings and parents on the playground or walk home alone.

Prior to our return from the summer break (on Monday 4th September) teachers will be in touch with their classes, to introduce themselves if not known to the children, to let children know about class routines/ topics for the half term ahead and to share pictures of their new learning environments.
